

DESCRIPTION: Human recombinant MBTD1 (residues 130-566; Genbank Accession # NM_017643.2; MW = 51.7 kDa) expressed as an N-terminal His-tag protein in *E. coli*.


PURITY: >95% by SDS-PAGE

SUPPLIED AS: $_{\mu}g/\mu L$ in 50 mM Tris HCl, pH 7.5, 500 mM NaCl, 1 mM TCEP, 10% glycerol as determined by OD₂₈₀.

STORAGE: -70°C. Thaw quickly and store on ice before use. The remaining, unused, undiluted protein should be snap frozen, for example in a dry ice/ethanol bath or liquid nitrogen. Minimize freeze/thaws if possible, but very low volume aliquots (<5 µl) or storage of diluted enzyme is not recommended.



Coomassie bluestained SDS-PAGE (4-12% acrylamide) of 4 μg of RBC MBTD1 (His). MW markers (left) are, from top, 220, 160, 120, 100, 90, 80, 70, 60, 50, 40, 30, 25, 20, 15, 10 kDa.



Differential Scanning Fluorimetry of RBC MBTD1 (His). Thermal denaturation of MBTD1 (His) is detected (CFX384TM Touch thermal cycler, 'FRET' channel; Bio-Rad) by increased binding and fluorescence of the dye SYPRO® Orange (Life Technologies). The apo form of MBTD1 (His) displays a Tm of 48.5°C.
